

ORDINANCE NO. 16C

ORIGINAL

An addendum to Ordinance No. 16B that shall go into effect immediately upon passage by the City Council of Maywood Park.

- A. No person may store, or permit to be stored, a vehicle or other personal property on public right-of-way or other public property in excess of 24 hours without permission of the City of Maywood Park.
- B. Failure to operate and move a vehicle or move non-vehicular property off of the block face within a 24-hour period constitutes prima facie evidence of storage and may be abated.


DEFINITIONS

“Vehicle” means any motorized device, not limited by omission, capable of moving or being drawn upon the streets or waterways, such as motorcycles, trailers, carts, campers, boats, recreational vehicles, buses, or other recreational/auxiliary vehicles and as defined:

- 1. Camper, ORS 801.180
- 2. Motor bus, ORS 801.200
- 3. Motorhome, ORS 801.350
- 4. Motortruck, ORS 801.355
- 5. Recreational vehicle, ORS 446.003
- 6. Trailer, ORS 801.560
- 7. Travel trailer, ORS 801.565


The City Council hereby declares an emergency, declaring that this Ordinance is immediately necessary to secure the continued general public health and general welfare of the citizens of Maywood Park, and that this Ordinance is immediately necessary to conserve, stabilize, and protect the property within the incorporated area of the City of Maywood Park. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately.

ORS 801.180 “Camper.” “Camper” means a structure that:

- (1) Has a floor;
- (2) Is designed to be mounted upon a motor vehicle;
- (3) Is not permanently attached to a motor vehicle upon which it is mounted;
- (4) Is designed to provide facilities for human habitation or for camping;
- (5) Is six feet or more in overall length;
- (6) Is five and one-half feet or more in height from floor to ceiling at any point; and
- (7) Has no more than one axle designed to support a portion of the weight of the camper. [1983 c.338 §28.]

ORS 801.200 “Commercial bus.” “Commercial bus” means every motor vehicle designed or used for carrying passengers and their personal baggage and express for compensation, except:

- (1) Taxicabs that:
 - (a) Are passenger vehicles with a passenger seating capacity that does not exceed five;
 - (b) Carry passengers for hire where destination and route traveled may be controlled by a passenger and the fare is calculated on the basis of any combination of an initial fee, distance traveled, or waiting time;
 - (c) Are operated under a current license or permit issued by a city, county, or other unit of local government where a permit or license is required for the operation of a taxicab; and
 - (d) Transport persons or property, or both, between points in Oregon.
- (2) Vehicles commonly known and used as private passenger vehicles and not operated for compensation except in the transportation of students to or from school. [1983 c.338 §32; 1985 c.16 §12.]

ORS 801.350 “Motor home.” “Motor home” means a motor vehicle that:

- (1) Is reconstructed, permanently altered, or originally designed to provide facilities for human habitation; or

- (2) Has a structure permanently attached to it that would be a camper if the structure was not permanently attached to the motor vehicle. [1983 c.338 §60.]

ORS 801.355 “Motor truck.” “Motor truck” means a motor vehicle that is primarily designed or used for carrying loads other than passengers. [1983 c.338 §61.]

ORS 801.560 “Trailer.” “Trailer” means every vehicle without motive power designed to be drawn by another vehicle. Trailer includes, but is not limited to, the following types of trailers:

- (1) Balance trailers;
- (2) Bus trailers;
- (3) Commercial bus trailers;
- (4) Farm trailers;
- (5) Manufactured structures;
- (6) Pole trailers;
- (7) Semi-trailers;
- (8) Travel trailers;
- (9) Truck trailers;
- (10) Self-supporting trailers; and
- (11) Special use trailers. [1983 c.338 §103; 1985 c.16 §28.]

ORS 801.565 “Travel trailer.” “Travel trailer” means:

- (1) A manufactured dwelling that is eight and one-half feet or less in width and is not being used for commercial or business purposes;
- (2) A recreational vehicle without motive power that is eight and one-half feet or less in width and is not being used for commercial or business purposes; and
- (3) A prefabricated structure that is eight and one-half feet or less in width and that is not being used for commercial or business purposes. [1983 c.338 §104; 1993 c.696 §8.]

ORS 446.003 Definitions for ORS 446.003 to 446.200 and 446.225 to 446.285 and ORS Chapters 195, 196, 107, 215, and 227. As used in ORS 446.003 to 446.200 and 446.225 to 446.285, and for the purposes of ORS Chapters 195, 196, 197, 215, and 227, the following definitions shall apply, unless the context requires otherwise, or unless administration and enforcement by the State of Oregon under the existing or revised National Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Act would be adversely affected, and except as provided in ORS 446.265:

- (37) “Recreational vehicle” means a vehicle with or without motive power, which is designed for human occupancy and to be used temporarily for recreational, seasonal, or emergency purposes and as further defined, by rule, by the Director.
