Re: Jack Young Sanitary/Refuse Collection Franchise

Dear Mayor Steffen:

The purpose of this letter is to memorialize the agreement reached between the City of Maywood Park and Jack Young Sanitary, Inc. Regarding the residential refuse collection in the City of Maywood Park, the City has consented to our subcontracting the physical collection of garbage, recycling materials and yard debris to Fred Wunsch, who is experienced and familiar with garbage collection generally and with whom Jack Young Sanitary has an ongoing business relationship relating to refuse collection. As we agreed, Mr. Wunsch will collect the Maywood route on Thursdays instead of the current collection day of Friday.

Notwithstanding this sub-contract to Mr. Wunsch, Jack Young Sanitary will remain the franchisee and will remain fully responsible to the City for all of our obligations under the franchise agreement. Jack Young Sanitary will continue to be responsible to make the recycling payments and the 5 percent franchise fee payments directly to the City of Maywood Park. In addition, Jack Young Sanitary or Marine Drop Box, Inc., another corporation which Paul Pietrzyk owns, will take care of the semi-annual clean-up tasks currently required by the franchise agreement and may be involved in other aspects of the franchise as well.




